15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B Sunday 14th July, 2024.

There are two kinds of prophets in the Old Testaments: The ones whose messages are contained in the bible and the "professional" ones - those that underwent training to become prophets; they learnt the art and skill of "prophesying." Upon graduation they were hired by people needing their prophetic services, such as the kings, the high priests and others who could afford their salaries. These kinds of prophets, prophecy what their employers wanted to hear. To do otherwise was sure to cost them their jobs.

The other kinds of prophets like; like Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, Jeremaih, Ezekiel, Daniel, and others are the ones that we read about in the Old Testament. These are of different breeds. They receive their commission directly from God, not from man, they say only what God wants them to say to the people. Amos, in our first reading is another example.

The twelve (Apostles) whom Jesus sent out in today's Gospel story continued the prophetic tradition of the Old Testament. They too did not belong to the establishment. They were simply "uneducated and ordinary men," but Jesus chose them, nonetheless. He chose them as St. Paul testifies in the second reading of today. This is the origin of the prophetic mission of the Church, even in our time. The Church has been constituted by Christ and sent by him into the world "to proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15).

The message of Jesus down through the prophets, and the apostles will unsettle a lot of people even within the Church today, the message she received from Jesus, no matter how unpalatable it may sound to anyone or the establishment. If you are looking for a sugar-coated sermons and homilies, do not look for them in the Catholic Church, you will not find them there, and the Church offers no apologies for that. Neither did the Old Testament prophets, nor the Twelve (Apostles).
