Sunday 8th September 2024.

Reflection: Towards the end of the liturgy of baptism, there is a little rite where the celebrant touches the ears and mouth of the newly baptized person and says: "The Lord Jesus made the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak. May he (soon) touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of Gpd the Father."

That ceremony repeats the gesture of Jesus when he opened the ears of a deaf man and loosened the ligament of his tongue to enable him to speak clearly, as we read in our Gospel story today. There is of course, a significant difference: the man in the Gospel story was physically deaf and dumb; that is, he could neither hear nor utter a spoken word. So, Jesus gave him the power to hear and speak physically. In the case of baptism, the recipients are not normally physically deaf and dumb; that is, they can hear what people are saying as well as speak themselves. Therefore, the gesture by the celebrant is not intended to make them hear and speak physically. It is intended to make them hear and speak the WORD OF GOD in a more than merely physical sense.

Someone would be deaf to the word of God if he/she refused to listen to it, those who found the word of God simply offensive (atheists or agnostics), people of other religion who are hostile to Christianity. Others include those who refuse to do what the word tells them. Regrettably. many of these are among us who profess the Christian faith today. Where dumbness in relation to the word of God is concerned would apply to people who make no effort to communicate that word to others.

What the Church needs in this, and every age are Christians who both hear the WORD OF GOD in such a way that its effects can be seen in their lives and are committed to the task of spreading that WORD to all and sundry. Are you in that group of people?
