Reflection: "GIVE ALL FOR THE KINGDOM"

Most human beings place a high premium on the integrity of their bodies. That is, given the chance, they would not want to lose any part of their bodies. They would like to carry all their limbs and organs intact to the grave. It does happen, however, that a limb or an organ can become so diseased as to threaten the very life of the individual. In such a situation, the doctor will normally prescribed amputation of the diseased limb or excision of the diseased organ to save the life of the patient. That is, the patient may have to lose a hand or a leg, an eye, a lung, or a kidney to stay alive. In most cases, the patient can be expected to go along with the doctor's prescription or advise. Hardly any patient ever prefers to die rather than lose a limb or an organ. As much as we value our limbs and organs, keeping them intact is not as important as staying physically alive. But one day, eventually, we shall still die; our physical life will terminate.

By contrast, life in the Kingdom of God is forever. It is also indescribably superior as St. Paul puts it, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him..." (1 Cor 2:9). That is the life in the Kingdom.

If people are prepared to sacrifice their limbs and organs literally to save their life physical lives, they should similarly be prepared to sacrifice their limbs and organs metaphorically to secure their life in the Kingdom of God. The limbs in the latter case are not our physical arms and legs, the organs are not our physical eyes, lungs, or kidneys. They are rather persons, things and activities that are of similar value to us as our physical limbs and organs are to our bodies. Do they sometimes threaten our possession of the Kingdom?

In today's gospel passage, Jesus commands that if and whenever such occasions and circumstances should arise, we should be prepared to cut off those limbs and organs for the sake of the Kingdom; that is, we should be prepared to forego those persons, objects and activities rather than lose possession of the kingdom. The words of Jesus come to mind: "What does it profit a man if he gains the whole World and suffers the loss of his own soul" (Matthew 16:26).
