First Week of Ordinary Time. YEAR C. SUNDAY, 12th January 2025

Reflection: Theme BAPTISM OF THE LORD

John the Baptist baptized a lot of people in the River Jordan. One of them was Jesus. John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. People who had sinned, and knew themselves to be sinners, made public repentance of their sinfulness by being baptized. But Jesus, the very Son of God, was the Sinless One. He had no sin that he needed to repent of. Therefore, he had no need for John's baptism. John acknowledged that much when he showed reluctance to baptize him. Only when Jesus insisted did John give in and baptized him (Mathew 3:14-15). So, why did Jesus submitted himself to be baptized by John? He did this for two reasons.

First, Jesus wanted to identify with the sinners who came to John's baptism right at the beginning of his public ministry, since the rest of his entire ministry would be devoted to saving sinners. He wanted to be seen as one of them, even though he was not really one of them in the sense of being a sinner himself. He had come as the Lamb of God, to take away the sins of the world (John 1:29). That was why he went to be baptized by John with a baptism of repentance that he did not need.

Secondly, the baptism of Jesus afforded John the Baptist the opportunity to recognize him as the Messiah for whom he was the forerunner. It is true that John must have known Jesus from childhood because they were related since their mothers were cousins, but John did not know that his relative, Jesus, was the Messiah. He was, however, given a sign by which he would recognize the Messiah. "He on whom you see the Spirit descended and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit, And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God" (John 1:33).

That was exactly what happened at the baptism of Jesus: The Spirit, like a dove, descended on him. When John the Baptist saw that, he knew that Jesus was the Messiah. He was further convinced by the voice from heaven that referred to Jesus with the words like those used by the prophet Isaiah to describe the Messiah that was to come in the distant future. We found that described of Isaiah in today's first reading.

After all that happened at his Baptism, John the Baptist was able to present him to his audience and his own disciples as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29). That was what he had been sent to do: to present the Messiah to the world. Therefore, his mission having been accomplished, he would decrease while Jesus would increase (John 3:30).
